Hi Colleen,

I am Robert and I am the Development Services Director here in Medina. The Medina city staff has been working with the City Attorney in reviewing our options on this matter. If KGM wants to try and do rubblization work within the boundaries of Medina, we believe this has to be requested as a revision to their existing shoreline permit, which is handled per the Washington Administrative Code and our shoreline master program. Because this involves review of a permit action, the City must be careful not to pre-determined anything. Instead, our strategy is to follow our permitting process where our questions are required to be answered in a satisfactory manner in order to move forward in the process. Please know that we do share the same concerns and questions that everyone else is expressing and any input or information you or anyone else might want to

share with us would be greatly appreciated. I would be interested to learn more about what information you might have about the Tacoma option. The more information we have, the better.

Hello Sheree and all in Medina,

As you probably know by now, the contractor for the demolition of the old SR520 bridge has been ousted from doing this process in the City of Kenmore.

As an alternative, KGM is proposing to do it right on Lake Washington in "container barges". This process would require spraying water with run-off pollutants into Lake Washington, in addition to exposing the pollutants directly into the air.

All of this nasty process is planned within our precious, cleaned -up shoreline where kids and all folks swim, kayak, paddleboard, water ski and fish. It is also the habitat of migrating salmon, and local fish and fowl species.

Our State Representative in the 46th is Gerry Pollet who has already met with us at City Council (CouncilMember Rob Johnson), and written a letter to the State Dept of Ecology to raise the "red flags" about the lack of public notice, issuance of permits, before any such process would take place.

The most appropriate alternative is to grind up the old bridge in an enclosed facility in Tacoma which of course, costs KGM a little more, to barge it down there.

King 5 has also picked up on this as well for press on this, and may be useful to our cause.

Tomorrow, I will be meeting with our Lake WA neighbors from Kenmore to discuss this further. It is our goal to stand arm in arm around the Lake WA shoreline to say "NO!" to "rubberizing (demolishing) the old bridge anywhere on the lake.

Can we count in Medina on the "other side of the pond " to join this cause?

Please let me know by 2:00pm tomorrow as we will meet at the "McDonalds" at NE 145th and Lake City Way tomorrow at 3:00pm to discuss quick and effective strategy to stop this potentially polluting process. Anyone is invited to join us!

Hi Everyone,

Heija Nunn contacted me last night expressing concerns that people were not aware of the public hearing tonight before the Medina Hearing Examiner relating to an application by KGM requesting a new technical noise variance. Their current one is set to expire in July. You are welcome to attend if you like, or if you

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want to submit written comments, please feel free to email them to me before the hearing and I will make sure the Hearing Examiner receives them. Just be sure to identify that the comments are for KGM's technical noise variance request. The hearing starts at 5:30 pm @ Medina City Hall.

Just a couple of notes on this:

- The technical noise variance is for both daytime and nighttime construction and demolition activity associated with both the floating bridge and the Evergreen Point Park and Ride. It does not have anything to do with the expansion joint noise, which is a design issue and not related to the construction activity.
- There was a question about whether the technical noise variance would include the rubblelization that was originally planned in Kenmore and is now being proposed to be done on barges in Medina; and the short answer is yes. However, the technical noise variance does not authorize the rubblelization activity to take place in Medina. The authorization part involves a revision to a shoreline permit that the City is still waiting to receive information on. Just as an FYI: KGM indicated that the added rubblelization would fall within the current construction noise levels that were already being planned as they would be using the same equipment to rubblelize as they are using to take the bridge apart.
- There was also a question raised about whether the rubblelization that was planned for Kenmore is now going to be trucked through Medina and the answer to that is no. While we knew since the Construction Mitigation Plan hearing that the debris from demolishing the East Approach that is located on land would have to be trucked through the haul route in Medina, the rubblelization that would take place on the barge would still be shipped to Kenmore and trucked through their City.

Subject: My concerns about the WSDOT/KGM Technical Noise Variance hearing in Medina tonight

Good morning Robert, Honorable Hearing Examiner and neighbors,

Thank you for articulating some of the concerns I expressed to you last night when I was at City Hall to check the Public Notice for this hearing on the locked bulletins board (FYI, it is not posted at City Hall.). Please add me to this distribution list as I would have preferred to have received the attached email directly from you.

Yesterday is the very first that I learned this important Public Hearing was scheduled for tonight at 5:30pm. Upon getting the information I went to the Medina website to find the Public Notice, the Hearing Examiner Agenda Packet and the staff report and recommendations. The Medina home page prominently features a link to a lengthy description about the cancellation of the original Hearing that was to occur May 18, 2016. The bottom of that note mentions that the meeting will be rescheduled. There is a calendar noting a Hearing Examiner meeting but no additional information. I clicked through Development Services and found an empty link to "Hearing Examiner Agendas." After some time looking for a Public Notice section. Eventually I chose to search the site map and located a link to Public Notices under City Clerk. Among the long list of links to PDF documents I found one listed as follows:

NOH TECHNICAL-16-001 SR520

Finally locating the link felt oddly victorious, but my thrill was short-lived when I realized there were no additional documents available.

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When I serendipitously crossed paths with you a short time later, we had a rather intense and hurried discussion about this application, the process, the notice and the implications this noise variance application could have on the "rubblization" controversy. I am certain that you and other city leaders will recall, after Kenmore used a clever and proactive strategy to punt noisy demolition work to our jurisdiction, I expressed concerns that KGM might choose to conduct both the environmentally murky and unquestionably noisy demolition and debris removal via truck route within our city limits. As of today, my understanding of our status on these concerns is:

Neither WSDOT or KGM has provided written and binding assurances that they DO NOT plan to add debris and equipment and other materials related to "rubblization" to their current Medina trucking approvals. I worry that Medina will now bear the brunt of all impacts related to construction and demolition because of the Kenmore settlement and WSDOT resistance to utilizing more environmentally friendly off-site facilities and practices. (Seriously, why would they if they can get us to agree to whatever they want no matter how noisy or dirty?)

B) You explained that while the proposed over water, barge demolition process is subject to an as yet received Shoreline Permit application, tonight's noise variance application would extend to that work as well. I don't quite understand how that works. They can have a noise variance approved for work they don't even have permitted? Given all the controversy and conversation around construction noise and increased noise from the as yet completed new span (which means it is still construction noise and should be measured as such) I am very concerned that impacted citizens in Medina and surrounding areas may not understand the broad impacts approving this noise variance could have on their quality of life. Without proper and considered Public Notice and available documents for review, your email this morning may have the effect of dissuading people from scrutinizing the details that include intense and noisy bursts of nighttime demolition.

C) Finally, as we continued our friendly but parried conversation I mentioned my shock at the documents and description available on the WSDOT website. Reviewing combined details from their lengthy What's Happening Now page (<http://www.wsdot.wa.gov/Projects/SR520Bridge/BridgeAndLandings/CurrentWork.htm#newbridgenoise>) and their Decommissioning Folio (http://www.wsdot.wa.gov/NR/rdonlyres/4AA8E017-F141-4850-9D8F-1F19C2F86848/0/2016_0608_DeCx_Folio.pdf) they clearly outline plans to conduct the rubblization near our shoreline and to use East staging areas for heavy work. Their plan, the impacts and anticipated noise are presented as foregone conclusions yet you maintain that WSDOT/KGM do not have the required permit permission to conduct the over water barge work within our city limits...yet. You said they will have to submit some sort of deviation request regarding their current shoreline permissions. You then said that you as Development Director would decide if you will make the decision administratively or require a Public Hearing. Given the tremendous impact and interest this project has on our entire community I would like to gently suggest that the City Manager and the City Attorney should bear the responsibility and oversight of that decision and naturally I believe a public Hearing is without a doubt the best path for transparency's sake.

As a result of my research and our conversation I would like to request the following;

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Please postpone the hearing until proper public notice has been provided utilizing the common practice of posting notice at City Hall and other designated locations in addition to the required site posting and 300ft mail notices.

I would like to request an electronic copy of the application, staff report and attachments. I also encourage the city to post this information and future hearing Examiner Agenda Packets in an easy to find online location.

I urge the City Manager and Development Services to add a condition to the permit if granted, that requires all work and noise associated with overwater rubblization and material removal must be considered under a separate permit and noise variance if required, subject to public hearing.

Please obtain written assurance from WSDOT and KGM that the Kenmore settlement/trucking plan will be the only manner of debris removal if by some sad reason the rubblization work does ultimately occur on Lake Washington.

I respectfully request that this letter be added to the hearing record for tonight and that my name be added to all future notices and communication related to SR520 construction and demolition.

As always, Robert, thank you for being informative, responsive, and a lively conversation partner. Let me know if you have any questions or if anything further is required to include my thoughts in the hearing record.

You are welcome to attend if you like, or if you want to submit written comments, please feel free to email them to me before the hearing and I will make sure the Hearing Examiner receives them. Just be sure to identify that the comments are for KGM's technical noise variance request. The hearing starts at 5:30 pm @ Medina City Hall.

Just a couple of notes on this:

- ? The technical noise variance is for both daytime and nighttime construction and demolition activity associated with both the floating bridge and the Evergreen Point Park and Ride. It does not have anything to do with the expansion joint noise, which is a design issue and not related to the construction activity.
- ? There was a question about whether the technical noise variance would include the rubbilization that was originally planned in Kenmore and is now being proposed to be done on barges in Medina; and the short answer is yes. However, the technical noise variance does not authorize the rubbilization activity to take place in Medina. The authorization part involves a revision to a shoreline permit that the City is still waiting to receive information on. Just as an FYI: KGM indicated that the added rubbilization would fall within the current construction noise levels that were already being planned as they would be using the same equipment to rubbilize as they are using to take the bridge apart.
