Fall Tips for Pollution Prevention

Autumn is just around the corner and as we prepare our gardens and lawns for the winter, the city would like to remind you to keep stormwater pollution prevention in mind this fall season. There are many sources to stormwater pollution, and some are unique to the fall season.

As leaves fall and garden harvesting comes to an end, the temptation to improperly dispose of yard waste is high.

Please remember, if leaves are swept into the street, they will be carried by stormwater into drainage basins and Lake Washington which degrades water quality and can be harmful to fish.



Here's how you can help!

- Never Rake Leaves into the Street
- Never Dump them into a Lake, Stream or Wetland
- Never Pile Leaves Near a Stream Bank or Lake
- Put Leaves in a Backyard Compost Pile
- Use Leaves to Mulch Your Garden or Lawn
- Drop Leaves Off at a Compost Site
- Consider Curb-Side Pick-Up
- Rake up Leaves Along Your Curb or Sidewalk Several Times During the Fall
- Periodically Clear Leaves from Storm Basin Grate

- **Medical Waste:** Intra-venous solutions, injectables, syringes, chemotherapy medications.
- Electronic Waste: Tube TVs, projector TVs, CRT monitors, and vacuums.

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2024 Medina Comprehensive Plan

On May 31st, 2024, the City finalized the first draft of its 2024 Comprehensive Plan and submitted it for review by public agencies and the public. The City received comments from various regulatory and reviewing public agencies over the summer and addressed comments by revising the draft Comp plan.

Subsequently, City and consulting staff prepared additional revisions to the Draft Comp Plan based on comments received from the City Council and the Planning Commission when the revised Comp Plan was presented at their September public meetings. Additional public input will occur at the Open House planned for Thursday, October 3rd, from 4 to 7 pm at City Hall. It will be hosted by City & Consulting staff working on the Comp Plan update and will provide attendees an opportunity to review the draft plan and ask questions prior to the public hearing on adoption of the Comp Plan scheduled to be heard before the Planning Commission on October 9, 2024. That meeting begins at 6 pm.

Middle Housing

A consultant has been chosen to work with the Planning Manager to complete the Middle Housing Update to the Medina Municipal Code to comply with the updates to state law enacted in the past several years. It is SCJ Alliance, which describes itself as "a multidisciplinary planning and engineering firm specializing in solving complex issues that challenge developing communities." The firm has worked on Housing Action Plans, Middle Housing Code Amendments and Missing Middle Housing Initiatives around the state.

The Middle Housing Public Engagement and Communication Plan is a working document that describes the goals, objectives, activities, and timeline for community engagement conducted in support of the Department of Commerce Middle Housing Grant in the runup to the June 30, 2025, deadline for compliance. SCJ's proposed scope of work is outlined in accordance with Medina's Plan and the Commerce grant schedule, tasks, and deliverables. It will be in four (4) phases over the next several months: Administrative and Project Management, Community Engagement and Draft Middle Housing Development Regulation Amendments and Amendment Adoption. Additional details will be released as this process moves forward and dates are set up for public engagement.
