

MEDINA CITY HALL CLOSED

On March 9, 2020, the Medina City Council approved a Proclamation of Local Emergency. To further the recommendations of Seattle - King County Public Health in response to COVID-19 (Corona Virus), City Manager Michael Sauerwein has ordered that City Hall be closed tentatively through April 24, 2020.

On March 23, 2020 Governor Jay Inslee issued a "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" proclamation for all Washingtonians. Following this directive, City Manager Sauerwein directed all non-essential staff to work from home. Our police force remains fully staffed and on duty and our Public Works crew will continue to provide essential services by skeleton crew. *Non-emergency city staff will continue to attempt to perform all other functions to the best of their ability under these tough times.*

The City of Medina remains committed to the health and safety of the community and will continue to monitor COVID-19. This is a fluid situation and as the situation changes, the City will adjust operations to respond in the best manner possible.
