General Situation:

Following King County's move to Phase 1.5 (of the State's plan of 4 phases), the focus is now shifting to contact tracing, testing and monitoring movements and spikes in transmission. The King County Board of Health is holding a special meeting on June 15, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. The topic on the agenda includes discussion and possible action on a resolution supporting King County's application to enter Phase 2 of the Safe Start Reopening Plan.

The Washington State Emergency Operations Center is currently responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel (new) coronavirus that was first detected in China. The virus has been named "SARS-CoV-2" and the disease it causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019" (abbreviated "COVID-19"). The Washington State Emergency Operations Center has been fully activated since January 22, 2020 with ESF 8 taking the lead in response efforts.

The Governor issued Emergency Proclamation 20-05 on Saturday, February 29, 2020. Ongoing executive orders and actions provide measures to reduce spreading of COVID-19.

The Washington State Emergency Operations Center is currently activated at Level one (1) Full Activation for the COVID 19 Response.

On Friday, March 13, 2020, President Trump declared a nationwide emergency pursuant to Sec. 501(b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5207 (the "Stafford Act"). This increases federal support to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in its role as the lead federal agency for the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic response.
